Dear Professor King, Bill Scott and Jo Watson,

I, and my friends and family, am deeply concerned about The King Review Interim Report proposing to have homeopathic medicines removed from pharmacies. I have used homeopathic medicines for my family with great benefit. **I would like to know what scientific evidence** *The King Review* used for its position that the 'sale of homeopathic products creates risk of harm'.

The report considers me incapable of making my own, informed choice about the type of healthcare I use. I should be able to choose exactly how I spend my healthcare dollars, and do not have faith in blindly following western medicine. Homeopathy, and other natural therapies, such as Kinesiology, have been exceptionally beneficial to myself, and many other people within my wide circle of acquaintances.

Australians are discerning people who spend their money wisely. It is no error of judgement that the use of homeopathy and other natural medicines is growing.

I do not believe that homeopathy has been properly, fairly and scientifically researched by Australia's peak medical body, the NHMRC.

Homeopathy is freely used by large numbers of people in Europe and many other countries, so why prevent Australians from using it?
