Residential Clinical section feels like an after thought.

Where is the section outlining what therapies are required to be delivered by a health professional, ie, is pain management required to be considered by allied health at all? You have mentioned exercise by allied health but not considered the reason for exercise and that the two go hand in hand.

Also, there is no information about allied health involvement in pressure care, manual handling or equipment prescription, and when a clinical issue becomes advanced and hence not the responsibility of the provider.

without minimum care minutes or any reference to allied health in the act or standards, providers need more information in these rules to figure out what the use of allied health in the RAC space that the govt expect.
