3) Section 33 – Assistance with transition care – (1) Transition care management (b) (ii) expand to include recreation/leisure - to read "spiritual, social, leisure, recreation and cultural activities"
4) Section 34 (8) change to "spiritual, social, leisure, recreation and cultural activities"

5) Section 39 (2) add in d) to enable the individual to participate in leisure and recreation based programs and activities.
